Tentative Schedule

Monday July 8

Arrive at USU Moab by 1:00pm
Afternoon is spent on camp orientation;
learning basics of rangeland management;
rangeland soils, rangeland plant growth and
development, and instruction of plant collection. Camp will be set up at Warner Lake
after dinner.

Tuesday July 9

Morning spent studying desert rangelands, learning and identifying plants, plant identification test. Afternoon spent studying foothill rangelands, use and management, rangeland improvements, livestock, wildlife, and watershed management; learning and collecting plants, plant identification test. Evening spent working on plant collections and notebooks, studying domestic livestock management practices.

Wednesday July 10

All day spent studying mountain brush and mountain grassland rangelands, learning to identify important poisonous plants, measuring forage utilization, rangeland improvements, livestock, wildlife, watershed, and recreation management, riparian habitat management. Evening spent working on plant collections and notebooks, studying domestic livestock management practices.

Thursday July 11

Practice FFA CDE, finish plant presses and journals, oral presentations.

Friday July 12

Camp clean up. Lunch at USU Moab, announcement of winners, and depart for home at 12:00 noon.
